5th JANAF'S INTERNATIONAL ENERGY & OIL CONFERENCE

JANAF Plc. celebrated its 45th anniversary and 40th year of its system operation by its traditional 5th International Energy & Oil Conference, entitled "Energy in the 21st Century", which was held in Zagreb on Tuesday, 3 December 2019, under the auspices of the President of the Republic of Croatia. The conference gathered over 200 national and foreign economic, energy and oil experts, as well as the representatives of the energy companies, the academic community, consulting firms and banking sector, and JANAF's business partners.

This year jubilee conference was opened by dr.sc. **Tomislav Ćorić**, envoy of the President of the Republic of **Croatia and envoy of Croatian Prime Minister**, Minister of Environment and Energy. The welcoming remarks were given by mr.sc. **Darko Horvat**, Minister of Economy, Entrepreneurship and Crafts, dr.sc. **Mario Banožić**, Minister of State Property, as well as by **Nikolay Petrovich Tokarev**, Chairman of the Management Board and President of Transneft and **Jaroslav Kocian**, Chairman of the Board of Directors of the International Association of Oil Transporters (IAOT), and also the Chairman of the Management Board of Czech MERO oil pipeline.



In his welcoming remarks, dr.sc. **Dragan Kovačević**, Chairman of the JANAF Management Board, focused on the growth and development of JANAF over its past 45 years and thanked all those who, during the four decades of JANAF's operation, have woven their work, knowledge and experience in order for the company to grow and become an indispensable energy factor even beyond the borders of the European Union and this part of Europe. "By responsible management of the company, proactive actions on the crude oil and petroleum product market, export orientation and investments, we achieved continuous growth and remarkable business results. Moreover, such results would not be possible without continuously investing in our employees and creating a working atmosphere that guarantees safety to our employees, as well as work and life balance", pointed out dr.sc. Kovačević.



"In the past 45 years JANAF has been one of the key players on the energy market and its role, as well as the role of Plinacro in the field of gas infrastructure and transport, makes Croatia an energy secure country", said Minister, dr. sc. Ćorić, indicating that JANAF's role in the oil and energy sector has become stronger year by year, which is also shown by the company's results. He pointed out that Croatia in the energy strategy up to 2030 and 2050 respectively is headed towards the affirmation of the renewable energy sources. Nevertheless, the role of oil and gas will not be significantly diminished in the transition period.

"It is precisely the reason why Croatia needs to be made each day less and less energy dependent in the context of supply routes as well, and here JANAF plays an important role, yet also in the context of production, where we are rejoiced by the fact that Croatian production reserves will be increased in the next period as far as hydrocarbons are concerned", said Minister, dr. sc. Ćorić. He said that Croatia undertakes all measures and steps in order to prevent the supply disruptions to occur and that the goals are clear — importance of and strengthening the supply routes along with revitalisation of domestic production, yet also activation of new energy resources.

"The energy is a factor that will most influence the shaping of society in the 21st century, and thus the state reflections should be strategic, turned towards the future, along with respecting the market regularities. In the next quarter of the century, there will still be a need for the oil and gas in order for the global energy demand to be satisfied, although such growth will be accompanied by the growing share of the renewable energy sources. In the energy transition, the oil companies will be the ones to undergo a transformation into the energy companies, and they will include more and more the renewable energy sources into their portfolio", pointed out dr.sc. Tomislav Ćorić, Minister, at the end of his opening remarks.





ENERGY IN THE 21st CENTURY

In his welcoming remarks at the conference, mr.sc. **Darko** Horvat, Minister, congratulated JANAF its 45th anniversary and 40th year of its system operation, highlighting the importance of such gatherings, as a place of exchanging opinions and experiences. Given the fact that the energy is an important segment of the Croatian economy, he pointed out that JANAF is a backbone of not only the energy, but of the entire economic system, having an important role in a new middle term investment cycle, and thus in the overall economic growth. He thinks that, if there is a crisis in Croatia, then it is a crisis of the management and poor business decisions, but in his opinion, "JANAF is precisely the proof that the companies in Croatia can be well managed, in a profitable manner and that they could be the key players in the region and beyond". Reflecting on JANAF's work, Minister, mr.sc. Horvat said: "JANAF is an important energy company in the Republic of Croatia, positioning itself as a crucial factor of the EU energy sector and, owing to its investment cycles, is a generator of the Croatian economy, ensuring, by its infrastructure, the stability and security of the crude oil and petroleum product supply."







By greeting those present at the conference, dr.sc. Mario Banožić, Minister, pointed out: "According to the analyses by the Ministry of State Property, JANAF is a highly liquid company, which, looking at the value of its assets and revenues that it realises, has a significant influence on the Croatian economy, achievement of the public goals, revenues of the state budget, as well as investments. The state, as its owner, within its powers, will continue to supervise the work and results of JANAF and to support the investments that will contribute to the further growth and development of the society. Therefore, as the owner's representatives, we welcome all further activities of the Management Board, Supervisory Board and General Meeting in the achievement of the stated goals."

In the conference introductory part, the congratulations to JANAF were also extended by **Nikolay Tokarev**, Chairman of the Management Board and President of Transneft and by **Jaroslav Kocian**, Chairman of the IAOT Board of Directors, welcoming JANAF's joining the International Association of Oil Transporters at the beginning of this year. The President of Transneft, Tokarev especially highlighted a major step forward in the JANAF oil pipeline system development, as well as progress in the cooperation between Transneft and JANAF in different areas.

The Chairman of the IAOT Board of Directors, Kocian pointed out that the association's main goal is the cooperation and development of the activities related to transport and storage of crude oil and petroleum products at the international, regional and national levels.

Dr.sc. **Dragan Kovačević** from JANAF in his presentation at the beginning of the conference sessions outlined the significance of the energy sector in the European economy, with special focus on Central and South Eastern Europe. He pointed out that, year by year, JANAF has been achieving record business results. In the last five years, he mentioned, the company has been one of the largest investors in Croatia, including both the public and private sector. "Our investments exceeded HRK 2,5 billion, which resulted in a fact that we are one of the most efficient companies and an indicator that there is no difference between the state and private ownership, what is important is the management", said Kovačević, pointing out that the company has been reorganised, redesigned and turned into the company, which is not only the transport one, but a small oil company.

He further announced that in the coming period, JANAF will dedicate its efforts to the investment projects related to the security of petroleum product supply of the countries in the region, due to which a new investment cycle will need to be initiated. The priority activities, as Kovačević indicated, will be directed to further modernisation and digitalisation of the system, as well as enhancement of the energy efficiency.

Sandor Fasimon, President of the Management Board of INA, presented the strategic development directions of INA in the next period. He pointed out that, despite the challenging environment, INA has achieved the growth and development in several business segments — production of oil and gas, oil refining and retail network development — owing to significant investments. He expects a share of the renewables to rise in the total primary energy consumption in the years to come, yet also that the liquid fuels will have a significant role in the global energy mix for quite some time.

INA will continue to develop in its traditional activities, and awaits a strong step forward into the diversification of the business in the alternative fuels, production of electricity and geothermal energy, electric mobility, production of fertilizers and carbon capture and storage. It will be achieved through organic growth, yet also through takeovers of other companies and joint ventures.

Over the next five years, INA will invest HRK 17 billion, of which 25% would be invested in the Rijeka Refinery, about one billion kunas in the filling stations, and 10% in new businesses. In turn, INA expects from these new investments to obtain additional revenues of HRK 20 billion.

The participants in the first round table discussion, entitled "Energy sector and oil companies — present and future" were as follows: Andrej Tučnin (NIS), Marino Velan (Vitol), Csaba Zsoter (MOL), Miha Kirn (Petrol), Dragan Letica (INA), Ivana Ivančić (PPD) and Bruno Šarić (JANAF).

The round table participants discussed the current situation on the oil market, factors influencing the volatile oil prices, assessments of oil market trends in the next 10 and 30 years, the biggest challenges in businesses of their oil companies and the level of diversification in the renewable energy sources, petrochemical industry and electric mobility, achieved by their oil companies in the recent years.







Eugene Lindell from JBC Energy gave an extensive and detailed overview of turbulences and trends on the European oil and energy market. He emphasised that the global oil market is characterised by OPEC's reduction of the production and decreased supply of heavy crudes, which is compensated by the increased production of oil shale in the USA, while on the futures market the backwardation situation dominates (lower oil prices in the contracts with later maturity dates).

The refinery market is defined by an increase in the processing capacities by 1,5 million barrels per day (mostly in Asia), poor demand growth and transition according to the IMO rules in vessel traffic, while the petrochemical sector has just entered in a hyper-production phase. The demand peak is expected to occur before 2030 and thus the integrated oil companies should be oriented towards the operations optimisation, particularly in the supply and refining, in order to maximise the short term pricing signals, since in that way they can best improve their profitability.

The participants in the second round table discussion, entitled "Energy transition and role of energy infrastructure" were as follows: Sergej Andronov (Transneft), Nebojša Lemajić (Transnafta), Ondrej Šmolik (MERO), Alessio Lilli (TAL), Marko Ćosić (HEP), Zoltan Aldott (MOL) and Vladislav Veselica (JANAF).

The discussions within the round table related to the current market position of oil pipeline companies and their perspectives, expected trends of the quantities transported by oil pipeline, experiences of the companies in the development of crude oil and petroleum product storage, possible changes in the oil import routes and final destinations on the European and Mediterranean markets, and adjustment of the companies to the climate enhancement policies and measures. The oil pipeline company of Transneft, which has the largest oil pipeline network in the world, is ready to increase oil deliveries to Europe, if there is such market interest in the EU, emphasised Sergey Andronov, Vice-President of Transneft.

He pointed out that the challenge for this part of oil sector lies in ensuring the stability and security of supply. The oil pipelines are maximally energy efficient, as indicated by the key experts from the sector, although investments into the development of new technologies and new standards still offer an opportunity for further enhancement.

The fifth JANAF's International Energy and Oil Conference was closed by dr.sc. Dragan Kovačević, Chairman of the JANAF Management Board, thanking all those present for their participation.

state secretaries, assistant minister and all government officials, dear Parliament Members and all state officials.

dear presidents and representatives of the Management Boards of the companies participating at the conference,

dear ambassadors and representatives of the diplomatic corps, dear representatives of scientific and professional institutions, dear media representatives,

dear conference participants,

I would like to welcome you all to this year conference, celebrating JANAF's 45th anniversary in both ceremonial and working atmosphere.

In my welcoming remarks, allow me to take a look back to JANAF's past and to reflect especially on its future.

45 years ago when the construction of the oil pipeline system with the terminals began, there were the times of enthusiasm and growth of both the oil sector and the petrochemical and chemical industry, but also of the construction of power plants, and a dynamic economic development in general. The oil consumption grew rapidly and reached 50 percent of the total energy consumption. The oil price amounted to USD 10 per barrel and the oil consumption was for 40 percent lower than today.

I would like to seize this opportunity to extend my special welcome to Croatian Prime Minister at that time and doyen of the Croatian management, former General Director of INA, Mr. Petar Fleković, who opened the works marking the commencement of the JANAF construction. The international consensus on the oil pipeline construction was of an extreme importance for today's seven states with nine refineries of the Central and South Eastern Europe: Croatia, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Serbia, Slovenia, Hungary, Slovakia and the Czech Republic. They agreed upon the most important parameters of the project, such as the capacities, routes, terminals and similar, and so the construction could start.

It lasted only four years and since then the company has been providing continuously to its users a reliable crude oil supply in terms of security and quality, mainly from the Omišalj direction, yet from the Druzhba oil pipeline as well, with a possibility of crude oil import from a numerous sources, namely the Middle East, Russia, Caspian region, Africa, the United States, etc. Over that period, 240 million tons of crude oil were transported, and 3.070 tankers were (un)loaded in the Port of Omišalj without a single accident. For foreign users, 60 percent of crude oil was transported

In the past 45 years,

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and JANAF realises 70 percent of its revenues by export. It confirms the international character and significance of the oil pipeline, as well as the company's export orientation.

In the recent years, after successful implementation of the diversification strategy of its business activities, JANAF (i.e. the Omišalj Terminal) became a respectable Mediterranean centre for storage of crude oil and petroleum products (Adriatic spot market), where major foreign companies are present (Glencore, BP, Vitol, Litasco and MOL), as well as the national companies and institutions (Croatian Hydrocarbon Agency, INA, Crodux, and others).

Although much talk is given today about transition, uncertainties and challenges for the energy sector, JANAF, like other companies, was faced, over the four previous decades, with numerous challenges and turbulences. Besides continuous price changes and decrease in the petroleum product consumption occurred in the last years, there were also the political crises on the Middle East and in the South Eastern and Central European countries that caused constant or temporary transport disruptions for certain users. Some of refineries are shut down or undergo a change in their business.

Regardless of all those circumstances, JANAF seized the opportunities, and grew and developed successfully, making many strategically important upgrades of its system.

The successful management of the company is also facilitated by applying the international standards for many years, namely related to the quality management system, environmental protection, energy management and others.

Moreover, by socially responsible business and numerous activities we want to show that JANAF is a Croatian economic entity, which contributes to the social welfare and the environmental protection, especially in the local communities where the Company operates.

We especially highlight the progress and achievements in the area of crude oil and petroleum product storage and trade, from which we obtain today 40 percent of the revenues. In the last six years, the capacities were more than doubled as concerns storage of crude oil and petroleum products.

In that six year period only, JANAF invested HRK 2,5 billion, including modern systems related to the security and protection of the environment, material goods and humans.

Dynamic and continuous investments have provided jobs for many local construction, metalworking and mechanical engineering, and other engineering and similar companies. Much credit for our company achievements also goes to them, as well as to all our customers. Owing to the storage development and to the growth of crude oil transport that

last year achieved the record quantities in the last 27 years, year by year JANAF's performance becomes better, with a constant growth of the revenues and the profit. At the same time, it is also an initiator of new investment wave that will mark the transition period of the company in the next middle-term period.

We have optimistic expectations that the EU policy on the energy supply security and the optimal use of the constructed facilities within the EU project of common interest (PCI), entitled the JANAF-Adria Pipelines (investors were MOL, Transpetrol and JANAF) will have a positive effect on the crude oil transportation growth. We expect to obtain the same effect from the implementation of the development strategy of our partners/buyers who modernise the refineries, who bought major oil fields and oil pipeline in the Caspian region, and who build petrochemical facilities. Altogether, it will increase their oil consumption, and the oil refining and demand for transport and storage respectively. Due to more stringent requirements regarding the environmental protection and security, our priority activities will be directed to further modernisation, especially the system digitalisation and improvement of the energy efficiency, as well as the use of renewables. In doing that, we will, as we have done so far, cooperate with both national and international professional associations. One of them is the International Association of Oil Transporters (IAOT), which we have recently joined, and for that I would like to thank Mr. Jaroslav Kocian, Association Chairman, and to extend my special thanks to our dear friend and partner, Mr. Nikolay Petrovich Tokarev, on whose initiative we were invited to ioin the Association.

Following and guided by the example of the largest oil companies, JANAF considers its further development also through new projects that will contribute to the realisation of the climate and energy goals and decarbonisation of the energy sector.

JANAF's success are reflected in a committed and efficacious work of our employees and strategic and development management of the Company. We have achieved all that in an excellent cooperation with our owners, customers, investment contractors, educational and scientific institutions.

I would like to seize this opportunity to thank you all, on behalf of the Management Board, and to invite you to further cooperation, agreement and realisation of new projects for mutual benefit.

I sincerely thank you for your coming to this year conference and I wish you a pleasant stay in Zagreb in its remarkable Christmas season atmosphere.

The intensive cooperation among all Association members takes over the 5 years with leading an open dialogue, exchanging of strategic information and sharing of valuable experiences. I am pleased to see that all members of the Association are example of managing an oil pipeline system as a modern system of transportation and storage of crude oil and petroleum products.

The main aim of the Association is to actively and comprehensively develop the sphere of transportation and storage of oil and oil products at the international, regional and national levels. And KazTransOil in cooperation with Association organized a competition entitled "Best in Profession."
